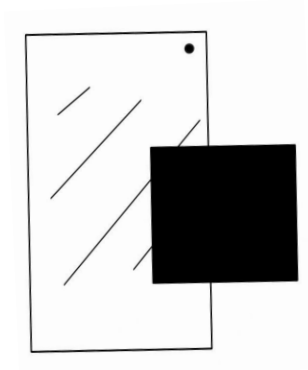
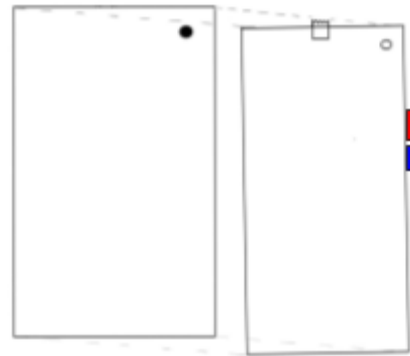


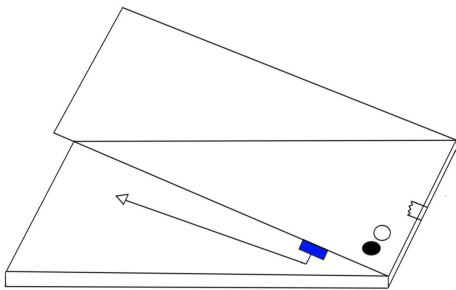
Before starting, sit in a bright area away from air conditioning, fans, or open windows. Wash your hands to remove as much oil and dirt as possible. Have clear tape, scissors, and a microfiber cloth handy.



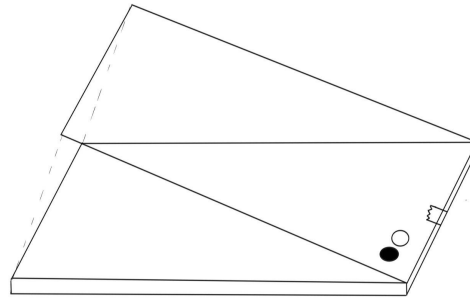
1. **Wipe** your phone screen as clean as possible with the microfiber cloth.



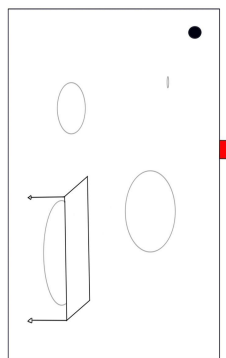
2. **Tape** the top of the screen protector to the top of your phone, while aligning the cutouts on the screen protector with the front camera.



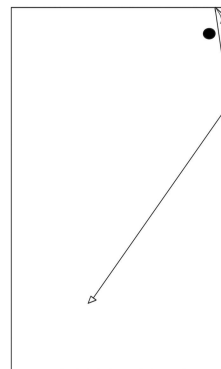
3. **Peel** the inner layer of the screen protector facing the screen using the blue tab. Do not let the screen protector fall.



4. Slowly **guide** the screen protector to the correct corners of the screen. Keep an eye on the camera too.



5. **Push** the bubbles out of the screen protector towards the edges with your finger or credit card.



6. Slowly **pull** the red tab to remove the top layer of the screen protector.

Type Of Screen Protectors

What the phone goes through day to day will ultimately be the deciding factor for what type of screen protector should be chosen.

Glass

Durable. Smooth. Naked. Glass screen protectors protect your screen without your finger knowing it's there. They often mimic the texture of your phone's glass, and last much longer than plastic protectors. On the flip side they're thicker, and are sometimes incompatible with specific cases. Make sure you check in advance if your case can fit a glass screen protector. Do you take good care of your phone without frequent drops? Glass is good for you.

Plastic

Traditional. Cheap. Replaceable. While cheap, they get the job done. They often come in packs of 3-5, so they will always be on-hand when they get too many scratches. They don't last long. When they scratch (and they do easily), it's easy to feel the scratch when brushed over with your finger. If the phone is dropped often, or is subject to scratches on a daily basis, these easily-replaceable protectors may be the way to go.

Prep

There are a couple things which make applying the protector easier and to avoid common issues such as mis-alignment, bubbles or dust underneath:

- A well-lit environment
- No sudden gusts of wind (such as from a window)
- Clean hands
- Tape
- Microfiber cloth

Clean

Dampen the microfiber cloth with some water, and remove any screen protectors that may already be on your screen. Clean the screen with the cloth to remove any smudges, fingerprints, dust and dirt.

Tape

Align the screen protector perfectly with the phone (there will be a hole in the protector to match with the front camera). Tape down the screen protector on the top of the phone by putting a piece of tape vertically from the top of the screen protector to the back of the phone.

Peel

Remove the plastic layer on the protector that is **facing** the phone screen from the top. Slowly peel and press down on the protector evenly to prevent any bubbles from appearing. If there is dust underneath the protector, take a piece of tape, wrap it around your finger, and dab lightly on the dust particle. Be gentle, and do not pull too hard on the screen protector. Only remove the screen protector to where the particle is to avoid more dust getting stuck. Do not peel the layer on the screen protector yet.

Set

To set the protector, press firmly on the screen and push out any air bubbles with fingers. When satisfied, peel the layer on top of the screen protector.
